

# MARION STINSON, LOCAL PHONE GIRL, IS KILLED IN CRASH

Pictou, April 10 (Special). — Miss Marion Stinson, an employee of the Bell Telephone Company of Toronto, was killed when the car she was driving struck a telephone pole and overturned, three miles west of Wellington, today.

Miss Stinson's chest was crushed when she was pinned beneath the car, and she lived only a few moments. A passenger in the car, James Haight, son of Mr. and Mrs. Gregory Haight of Wellington, living at Apartment 47, 2341 Yonge Street, Toronto, and employed by Miln-Bingham Limited, 22 Front Street West, Toronto, escaped with only a slight cut on the left ear and a bad shaking up.

Miss Stinson was driving a rented car and was going to Wellington, where she intended to pick up her mother and take her back to Toronto to live with her.

The car failed to make a corner and when the brakes were applied jumped the ditch, struck the telephone pole and landed on its top. Apparently the door came open, throwing Miss Stinson out, so that the car fell upon her.

Ralph Graham, who saw the accident, and his father, W. A. Graham were the first on the scene and helped Haight lift the car from the injured girl.

Coroner R. A. Thompson of Wellington stated that it was unlikely an inquest would be held.

Miss Stinson was a former employee of the Bell Telephone Company in Wellington, moving to Toronto some years ago. She was in the middle forties. Her mother, Mrs. Thomas Stinson, is an invalid.
